She was preceded in death by father Ronald E. Secrist (2003); and sister Toni Secrist (1968).

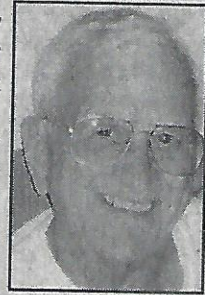
