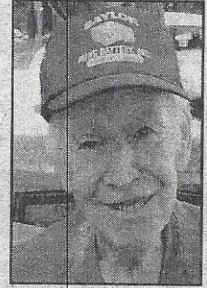
There will be a time of visitation with the family one hour prior to the service Thursday at the church.
