

Deanna "Dede" Myers, 78, a lifetime resident of Kosciusko County, passed away quietly at 2:54 a.m. Friday, Sept. 1, 2017, in Warsaw's Kosciusko Community Hospital.



Deanna was born July 25, 1939, near North Webster. She was the daughter of Fredric Kuhn and D'Maris Shock Kuhn. She was a 1957 graduate of Leesburg High School.

On Sept. 24, 1960, Deanna was united in marriage with Ralph J. Myers in their pastor's Dunkirk home. Together they would share nearly 57 years before her passing. Ralph survives in Warsaw.

Never one to shy away from work, Deanna held several jobs throughout her life. From 1960 to 1972 she managed the Bibler Trailer Court. She had also worked for the TIMES UNION newspaper in several capacities but, most recently, she had worked in central filing for Lake City Bank. She retired from the bank in 2004 with 22 years of faithful service.

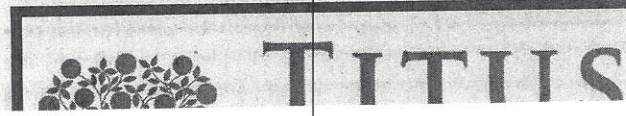

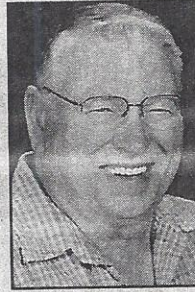

Harry spent much of his life working on farms. He met Joyce while working for her father and eventually married the boss's daughter. He and Joyce purchased their own egg farm, and ran that for several years before Harry went to work in Elkhart for Bullard Farms. In 1976, he relocated his family to Rensselaer and worked for Fairview Egg Farm.

Eventually, he and his wife moved to Lafayette, and Harry went to work for the Indiana Veterans Home as a member of the custodial staff. During his time there, he realized that he enjoyed washing windows, and in January 1991 he started his own business, M&M Window Washing, through which he washed business windows in the Lafayette and surrounding communities until his death.

Harry attended Wea Ridge Baptist Church, Lafayette, and thoroughly enjoyed the fellowship and would often mention his love of their inclusion of old hymns in their services — he and his wife loved those songs over the years.

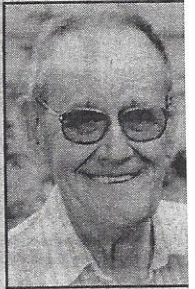
