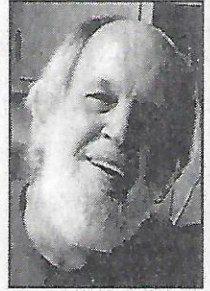


Curtis Ousley Jr.
