She and her husband enjoyed wintering in Florida for many years.

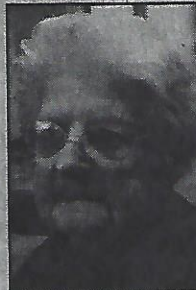
