
McKee heads school board

Following is an ex-cerpt from the story of Dr. Newton J. Clymer, who practiced medicine in Talma from 1879 to 1918

"I can safely say that have \$60,000 in unт paid accounts upon my books," Dr. Clymer said when interviewed by a Sentinel representative in 1916. The article described Dr. Clymer as described Dr. Clymer as the oldest physician in the county--he would be 79 years old on his next birthday. He retired from active practice years ago but insists on coming to his office every day to prescribe for a number of people who have been his pat-ients for years.

"No man," said Dr. ymer, "knows better Clymer, "knows bette than I that our custom and habits have changed and habits have changed in the last 50 years. The modern physician an-swers a call received over the telephone in a fast automobile, while 35 to 40 years ago (in the 1880s) when I had the largest practice in the largest practice in the county, I usually went to the bedside of my patient on horseback after some member of the after some member of the family had made a quick trip in the same manner to call me. When I liv-ed at Talma, after the Civil War, the roads were very bad and near-ly impossible during the rainy season. For days once, I never took off my clothes, riding from house to house durine a house to house during a bad epidemic of fever; in those days the com-mon illness was plague and intermitent fever.

ccasion. C. Coats, which will be judged solely as a coat with its own ac-

cessories. D. Suit or costume--D. Suit or costume--suits being two or more pieces (skirt and/or pants with its own jac-ket, cape or vest, usu-ally of the same fabric, shown with or without its own blouse.) Cos-tumes can be a dress or suit with its own jack-et or coat. et or coat.

et or coat. E. Separates-true co-ordinates. May be two, three or more pieces de-signed and put together for a complete look. However, each piece sh-ould be important enough to stand on its own for possible use with other garments. True coordi-nated separates do not depend on the number of pieces but on the type

depend on the number of pieces but on the type of fabric, pattern, co-lor and effectiveness of coordinated complete look or looks. F. Evening wear -- any costume, any style, any length suitable for af-ter 5 p.m. General rules are: garments modeled must have been made since Sept. 1, 1973; contest-ant must pre-register for participation; com-testant may enter in on-ly one category; contesly one category; contes-tant must reside in the tant must reside in the county in which she par-ticipates; there will be one winner in each cat-egory for each division; any suitable fabric or technique such as knit-ting, crocheting, hand-weaving, etc. may be us-ed; any length suitable for the occasion may be used in any category; and if the contestant is selected to go on to the State Fair she must

model the same garment that won for her at the county level. If desir-ed, she may change ac-cessories or improve workmanship.

Judging will be on a point basis with 35 points allowed for the constructed article, 30 for the contestant and 35 for the costume on the contestant.



It Happened In Mentone

Taken from the July 14, 1948, issue of the Northern Indiana Co-Op News:





But he remembers those days as fondly as those who were more in the limelight, and his toarmates bare more in the limelight, and his teammates have a host of "Paul Park" stories to delight the

stories to delight the listener. "We didn't know a thing about football," Park says of the 1924 team, the first Manches-ter ever put on a field. "We didn't have any equipment to speak of, because we didn't have the money for it. Even the coach-Carl Burt--was learning. "It hustled us to have enough players to prac-

enough players to prac-tice against. I was on enough players to prac-tice against. I was on about the third or four-th team, and we'd play the role of the oppos-ing team each week in practice. I played a lot of that. It was cheaper than buying dummies."

Park is now retired and living in Silver Lake. He gets back to the campus frequently, to visit a few old friends, but admits he's lost track of many of triends, but admits he's lost track of many of his football team mates.





#### Set trial for accused Wallis slaver

Donald Lock, 27, ac-cused of raping and slaying Nena Wallis, 30, a former Mentone resi-dent, in her Ft. Wayne apartment last Feb. 20, will be tried for first and second-degree murdand second-degree murd-er on Sept. 17 in Allen Co. Circuit Court, Fort Wayne.

Wayne. Lock was originally scheduled to begin trial Monday but Circuit Court judge Hermann F. Busse delayed the proceedings pending a hearing on a defense move challenging the constitutional lity of a recently passed state law providing the death penalty. Allen Co. Prosecutor Arnold H. Duemling is seeking the death penal-ty for Lock.

seeking the death penal-ty for Lock. In an information re-port filed by Duemling, Lock allegedly killed Miss Wallis while raping her and then stabbed her with a pair of scissors. The report also states Lock was convicted on lis Lock was convicted on Jan. 8, 1963 for anothunrelated crime of er,

er, unrelated frime of rape. Lock's attorneys, Pub-lic Defenders Barrie C. Tremper and Thomas L. Rayn, have filed a pro-tective order seeking to suppress "any and all" proof of a prior conviction as alleged on Duemling's filed re-port. port.

According to the 1973 law, any person "killing a human being while per-petrating or attempting to perpetrate rape, ar-son, robbery or burglary by a person who has had a prior related convic-tion of rape areon rob tion of rape, arson, rob-bery or burglary" should

sentenced to death. Lock's defense attorneys have challenged apneys have challenged ap-plication of the death penalty statute on the grounds that Lock was a' juvenile under 18 years of age on the date of the alleged 1963 rape conviction. They furth-er argue that Allen Cir-cuit Court had no juris-diction in Lock's 1963 trial and therefore the trial and therefore the trial and therefore the results of the 1963 rape trial are void. They also argue that Lock's juvenile records are confidential and there-fore inadmissible in the proceedings relating to the slaying of Miss Wal-






